Overview

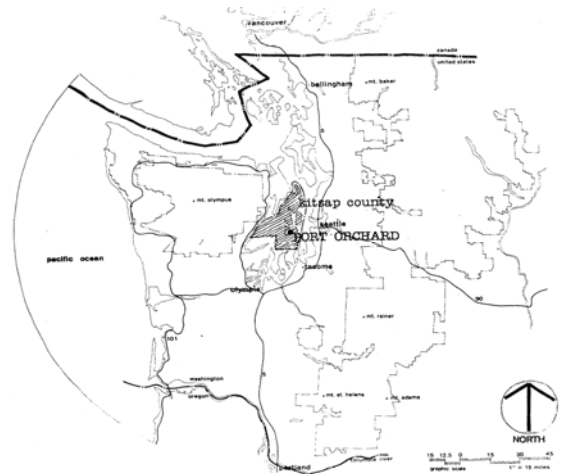
