The Port Orchard Police Department is accepting applications from citizens who want to make a positive difference in the City of Port Orchard.

Volunteers are being sought to help reduce speeding in their neighborhoods. Their job will be to go where the department has received complaints of speeding vehicles. The volunteers will write down the license plate, make and the time a vehicle was observed along with the speed shown on the radar.

This information is given to the police department. The department runs a registration check and then issues a letter to advise the owner of the vehicle of the speed recorded. The letter carries no legal weight but simply advises the motorist that someone is watching.

You must be a resident of the City of Port Orchard. A background check will be made on participating members. They will then receive training on how to correctly use the radar gun.
